NATIONAL DIGITAL LITERACY MISSION in C.S.C at S.M.C.E.P.C

"Digital Literacy is the ability of individuals and communities to understand and use digital technologies for meaningful actions within life situations".

Making one person in every family digitally literate is one of the integral components of the Prime Minister's vision of "Digital India", which the P.M. had proudly launched in California, in the Silicon Valley, during his most recent visit to the U.S.A.

The Digital Saksharta Abhiyan (DISHA) or National Digital Literacy Mission (NDLM) Scheme has been formulated to impart IT training to 52.5 lakh persons, including Anganwadi and ASHA workers and authorized ration dealers in all the States/UTs across the country so that the non-IT literate citizens are trained to become IT literate so as to enable them to actively and effectively participate in the democratic and developmental process and also enhance their livelihood.

Appreciation of Digital Literacy (Level 1) is the training course being imparted at CSC, Thirupachur and it aims: to make a person IT literate, so that he/ she can operate digital devices, like mobile phones, tablets, etc., send and receive emails and search Internet for information, etc.

Five Videos prepared by National Informatics Center (N.I.C.) were given by the trainers to the C.S.C operators to facilitate the N.D.L.M. training and the contents are :

Module 1: Power in your Hands-introduction to digital devices

Module 2: Introduction to the Internet

Module 3: E-Mail and Social Media

Module 4: Access to Information

Module 5: Government Services

Module 6: E-commerce

Module 7: E-Security

After the candidates successfully completed the 10 day 20 hour course given above and the 2 day revision, they take the online exam and if successful, they are awarded a certificate by N.D.L.M. (of the D.E.I.T.Y) and the National Institute of Open Learning (N.I.O.L.)

LAUNCH OF NATIONAL DIGITAL LITERACY MISSION TRAINING PROGRAMS in C.S.C at S.M.C.E.P.C
